Your County 250 Committee

Why?

Though the American Revolution began in the North, it was won in the South. South Carolina boasts over 400 battles, skirmishes, and bloodshed that ultimately led to the British surrender. This is in addition to what the everyday residents, workers, indigenous, and enslaved witnessed. Each community knows its own stories and how best to tell them.

When?

Now! The SC250 Commission has chosen the years 1770-1783 (2020-2033) as the anniversary years. Why? This takes us from when many of the seeds of the conflict began to fester, after the French and Indian War, and when the when Great Britain recognized the independence of South Carolina and the other colonies in the Treaties of Paris, which officially ended the war.

There should definitely be fireworks on July 4, 2026, but so much more. Did you know the first official bloodshed outside of New England took place at Ninety Six, SC in 1775? The famous battle at Fort Sullivan (renamed Moultrie) in which South Carolina patriots completely defeated British forces attacking Charleston took place the month before the Declaration was signed. Many of the known stories and actions in SC didn't take place until The Southern Campaigns 1779-1782 so there are many years of celebrations to come.

COMPLETE

1. Verify Whether or Not Your County Already Has A Committee

SC250 would like there to be only one “official” SC250 Committee in each county. To see if a group has already formed in your county, visit SouthCarolina250.com and/or check with your county administration.

2. Reach out to SC250

One of the Commissioners or the Executive Director would love to meet with your initial group to review these suggestions and help with the conceptualization of the Committee as well as later appear before the County Council if desired.

3. Gather Your County’s Stakeholders

Here are our suggestions for best practices to help get you started:

A. Form a Coalition with existing Historic & Heritage, Tourism, and Economic Development Groups in Your Community

As we are asking for one group per county, it is going to be imperative that the County 250 Committee has representatives from all local historic and cultural organizations. They are your base. Get more things done together.

3. Gather Your County's Stakeholders *(continued)*

B. Be Intentionally Inclusive

The first step in making sure that all stories are told, even those often traditionally left out of textbooks like those of African Americans, Native Americans, Women & Children, and Loyalists. Remember sections of your community that may not have been as large in the 1700s, such as our Latinx and Asian communities. Celebrating America is something that can unite us all, and you can be intentionally inclusive when forming your committee (See p.17, Tell A More Complete Story)

C. Diversify Skill Sets

Yes, gather your historians (we love historians) but also find people with other skills such as marketing gurus, business people, community advocates, artists, local media members, tourism and economic development, recreation fans, influencers, college social media majors, local elected officials, and more.

D. Remember Your Rural Community Members

As we are asking there to be only one official group per county, don't forget to include members from all townships in your county and even the rural sections of your county. That is often where the stories, action, or sites took place.

4. Create Your List of Contacts *(see Appendix A on p.20)*

A. Primary Contacts

- You will need an **Internal Contact** to serve as your point person between SC250 and your committee. SC250 will communicate directly with your Internal Contact to share County 250 updates.
- You will also need an **External Contact** who will interact with the Public and report back to the County 250th Committee. Because of this, the External Contact's preferred contact information will need to be available publicly on the SC250 website.
- Your **Internal Contact** and **External Contact** can be the same person if they're willing to serve both roles, or this can be filled by two different people. In addition, your **External Contact** can also be an organization *(like your local museum or other organization)*, a county admin *(with permission)*, or even a generic email address a committee member agrees to monitor.
- Please be sure to designate these roles appropriately when submitting your Contact List.

B. Committee Members

- Be sure to collect information from your entire committee.
- Let all parties know they will be subscribed to the SC250 eNewsletter. They can unsubscribe at any time.

C. VIPs

Start by asking your local elected officials, celebrities, and media if they are interested in being a part of the committee, but if they are too busy ask them about being on a contact list so they are kept in the loop. While these are countywide committees, do not forget your municipal officials.

6. Pass a County Resolution (see Appendix B on p.21)

Have your county council pass an official resolution supporting the committee.

See Appendix B for a sample resolution.

7. Register with SC250

Once steps 1–6 are complete, you can officially register your committee by submitting:

- Your Contact List (including Primary Contact, Committee, and VIP indications)

8. Look for Your Lapel 250 Pins!

1. Decide on a Fiscal Agent

This could be your city/county government, local PRT department, local museum, non-profit, or Chamber of Commerce, for example. You will know best how to structure this in your community. Remember for many of the SC250 Grants county governments may designate grant funds to another entity like a non-profit as long as the top elected official and county administrator signs the grant agreement.

What's Required?

- A. The fiscal agent will be required to sign the grant agreement once awarded
- B. Manage All County 250 funds
- B. Oversee that state procurement rules are followed when state funds are used in a purchase or contract. Review online at <https://procurement.sc.gov>
- C. Agree to an audit of funds if deemed necessary
- D. Provide Fiscal Agent Documents for all SC250 grants including:

- Contact information
- W-9
- The adopted budget for the current year
- The most recent operating financial statement
 - If the Fiscal Agent has just been established, include some documentation to that fact

If the applicant or fiscal agent is a Non-Profit, we also need the following documentation:

- IRS 501c3 or 501c6 letter
- Secretary of State Registration letter
- List of Board members

2. Apply for a County 250 Organizing Grant

These \$3,000 grants are non-competitive and only require submission of the completed application by the official County 250 Committee.

What's Required?

A. Register for the Discover SC Web Grants Program at scprtgrants.com/index.do.

All SC250 grants must be applied for through this online application program. **Even if you are not ready to apply, you are encouraged to register now**, as you must be approved by an SC 250 Administrator in Web Grants before starting an application.

B. Decide on a Project from the Approved List

- Strategic Planning for your Committee's Education, Commemoration, and/or Tourism Activities
- Survey of American Revolution Era People, Places, & Stories
- Historic Research and/or Archeology of an American Revolution Era Site in Your County
- Historic Research to help rediscover the often lost voices of African Americans, Native Americans, Women, and Children
- Designing a Revolutionary Era Trail/Tour in your County (or with Surrounding Counties)
- Memorialize your hero/heroines' American Revolution actions with statues, markers, art, etc.
- Mark your 18th-century roads, trails, forts, muster grounds, churches, buildings, and other points of interest.
- Other – If you choose Other, please describe your proposed project.

C. Be the "officially recognized" 250 Committee for your county.

Yay! You completed that on page 10.

D. Be about the business of celebrating the American Revolution in your County.

Other Grants

The South Carolina State Library's Grants Research Assistance includes general grants and funding information as well as the SC Foundation Directory. Learn more at statelibrary.sc.gov/grants-research-assistance.

State Procurement Protocols

Remember that grantees awarded state funds must follow state procurement protocols. Be sure to review all requirements at procurement.sc.gov. Below are some state procurement paperwork basics.

- A. \$0 to \$10,000
 - Invoice (*must show correct amount charged and payee*)
 - Proof of Payment
- B. \$10,000.01 to \$25,000
 - Three (3) written quotes
 - Invoice
 - Proof of Payment
- C. \$25,000.01 and Up
 - SC Business Opportunity Ad or Copy of Public Advertisement (*i.e., Local Newspaper Ad*)
 - Bid Specifications (*relevant pages only, doesn't have to be the entire package unless specifically requested*)

Remember IT IS MORE IMPORTANT TO FIND AND APPLY FOR GRANTS FIRST. YOU'LL NEED TO COMPLETE THESE TWO REGISTRATIONS BELOW IN ORDER TO ACCEPT GRANTS, BUT NOT IN ORDER TO APPLY FOR THEM, WHICH MEANS YOU CAN ALWAYS COMPLETE THESE STEPS AT A LATER DATE.

- Register as a "State Vendor" to be eligible to receive any grant funds. Visit procurement.sc.gov > Doing Business with Us.
- Register with the State Treasurer's Office for ACH Direct Deposit. This greatly speeds up any grant distribution. Visit treasurer.sc.gov/what-we-do/for-businesses/electronic-payment-information.

Whereas South Carolina created the South Carolina American Revolution Sestercentennial Commission (250th Anniversary Commission also known as SC250);

Whereas the mission of the SC250 Commission is to celebrate and promote South Carolina’s role in the American Revolution by educating, engaging, and inspiring South Carolinians and visitors;

Whereas the SC250 Commission is seeking partnerships with counties and municipalities to further its mission;

Whereas this partnership will be formed by creating a local committee called [County Name] County 250 Committee.

Whereas the [County Name] County 250 Committee will focus on important events, people, and places within [County Name] County to celebrate and promote [County Name]’s role in the American Revolution by educating, engaging, and inspiring South Carolinians and visitors;
