



INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE REVIEW TEAM

Thank you for participating in the review process for the **SC American Revolution Sestercentennial Commission (SC250 Monthly, Major and Premier Project Grant Programs)**. The purpose of these instructions is to provide you with an overview of the programs and the steps of the review process. The effectiveness and integrity of our grant programs depend on the work of our advisory teams. Your efforts ensure that evaluations and funding decisions are informed, and that all applicants are fairly treated.

ABOUT THESE GRANT PROGRAMS

There are 3 Competitive Grant Funding Opportunities: Monthly, Major, and Premier Project Grants.

Monthly Grants

- **Amount:** up through \$15,000
- **Timeline:** Up to 12 months
- **Reviewed:** Monthly
- **FY26 Deadlines:** 3/2/26, 4/1/26, 5/1/26, 6/1/26
- **Match Required:** Not required; however, partnerships and cost share matching funding are highly encouraged
- **Distribution:** 80% upfront, 20% reimbursed at completion of final report.

Major Grants

- **Amount:** \$15,001-\$125,000
- **Timeline:** up to 24 months
- **Reviewed:** Quarterly
- **FY26 Deadline:** 3/26/26, 6/26/26
- **Match Required:** 20% of Total Budget
- **Grant Distribution:** 80% upfront, 20% reimbursed at completion of final report.

Premier Project Grants

- **Amount:** \$125,001+
- **Timeline:** Completed by 2033
- **Deadline:** Quarterly
- **FY26 Deadline:** 3/26/26, 6/26/26
- **Match Required:** 25% of Total Budget

- **Grant Distribution:** 80% upfront, 20% reimbursed at completion of final report

Competitive Grant Types

Under each grant funding opportunity, there are several grant types.

- **Museum & Library Style Exhibit Grants:** Create American Revolution indoor panels and/or digital displays, telling local American Revolution stories (meant to be permanent or extended installations). SC250 is also sponsoring "interpretive centers" featuring one American Revolution topic with information about how to learn more at other venues. Call for more information.
- **Local Activities Grants:** Provide seed money for local 250th celebrations. What activities are you planning in your community?
- **Historic Tourism & Marketing Grants:** Support cultural tourism marketing related to the American Revolution in SC. From regional American Revolution brochures to promoting visitation of a fully developed site to promoting an annual event, how will your team support American Revolution tourism in SC?
- **Research, Publication, Genealogy, & Digitization Grants:** Advance research and public availability of publications on SC's role in the American Revolution. SC250 is also supporting genealogy centers so the public has access to materials used to trace lineages back to the American Revolution, particularly for researching African American and Native American genealogy. Let's make SC during the American Revolution research easier with online primary sources through digitization.
- **Education Grants:** One of the primary goals of the SC250 Commission is education. This can be for K-12 or kids of all ages. K-12 projects should be aligned with state standards and in collaboration with local districts.
- **Signage & Marker Grants:** Aid in placing or replacing American Revolution in SC signage from interpretive signs to labeling 18th century roads to installing wayside directional signage to funding for state historic markers. All state historic markers will need to comply with SCDAH standards and approval process. All other interpretation must be approved by SC250 Peer Review prior to production.
- **SC American Revolution Site Grants: Planning, Acquisition, Development, Renovation:** Planning can include a pull-off design or due diligence before acquisition. All archaeology applications should be to establish the site's significance and to prepare the site for cultural tourism development. Site grants also assist with acquisition and/or development of new American Revolution sites. Note that construction of new buildings (particularly multi-use buildings) is not the primary goal of SC250 and should be discussed with SC250 Executive

Team before applying. Development could include decent training costs and/or signage. Any renovation requests should be added value to a site not just for deferred maintenance.

*Grant funding is dependent on allocations from the State Legislature each year. SC250 may choose to fund, not fund, or partially fund applications. The Commission retains the right to make exceptions or alter the up to amount that can be approved for each grant. All information is intended to be a summary and subject to change. BEFORE BEGINNING YOUR REVIEW

- Read and become familiar with SC250 Grant Guidelines, Evaluation Criteria, Scoring Matrix and other information provided in this handbook.
- Ensure you are able to log into the Discover SC WebGrants portal at <https://www.scpgrants.com/logout.do>. See the provided step-by-step for completing your registration.
- Complete and return the Conflict of Interest Policy form (sample located on page 27) to Heather Hawkins at hhawkins@southcarolina250.com. (SC250 will probably send this form to you electronically through Adobe Sign so check your email for the ease of doing it online.) If you discover a connection to a proposed applicant or project after reviewing the application, please contact SC250 right away so we can mark you as abstaining from that review.

SC250 ELIGIBILITY REVIEW

The SC250 Grants Manager and/or Grants Assistant will do a cursory eligibility review for criteria and paperwork. Concurrent with your review a representative of the SC Department of Archives & History and SC250 CEO will rate the project.

DURING YOUR REVIEW

- Read every application. Pro Tip: Download a full version of the application before beginning the scoring. (Pdf attachments will print with application so watch page range if you don't want to read the entire audit report).
- Don't forget to check out any additional attachments in the support documents section. Blue text are links and can be downloaded or viewed with a click.
- All scores and comments should be related to the included criteria; a scoring matrix for each item has been provided in this handbook to assist you.
- **We request that you provide at least one comment for each application;** please be specific, clear, and constructive with any concerns. **Note: that any comment is subject to the Freedom Of Information Act.** Questions and concerns will be used for administration due diligence. Any comment may also be provided to applicants upon request to communicate the strengths and weaknesses of the project/application and the rationale for funding decisions; comments will not be attributed to individuals, but to the review team as a whole, even if the comments are contradictory.
- Adhere to the Conflict of Interest/Confidentiality Policy. Panelists are not allowed to review, score, or comment on any application with which they have a conflict of interest. Notify the Grants Manager immediately if you discover a conflict with a partner or individual listed on the applicant.

DUE DILIGENCE

The SC250 executive team will utilize the composite scores and comments in determining a final recommendation. They will also determine if a meeting with the applicant for clarification or due diligence is required.

You may be asked to participate in a follow-up discussion (i.e., applications with significant score variances).

This additional due diligence may extend the decision process.

RECOMMENDATIONS/AWARDS

The Executive Team will take into consideration all reviews and comments before making a final recommendation or award. Final allocations/awards are approved based on the amount of the grant budget request:

- Grants up to and including \$15,000 by Executive Director OR Chairman OR Vice-Chairman.
- Grants from \$15,001-\$50,000 by the Executive Committee.
- Grants exceeding \$50,000 by the full Commission or its delegates as may be determined by the full Commission.

SC American Revolution Sestercentennial Commission Grants on the Discover SC Web Grant Program

Review Panel Priorities

With needs across the state and limited resources, SC250 is giving priority to projects that:

- are specifically about the American Revolution in South Carolina 1770-1783 or from December 2025 to May 2026 due the applications check a Carolina Day menu item. *Note the events do not have to occur on the date listed on the Carolina Day menu as long as they happen during the summer of '26. <https://southcarolina250.com/carolinadays/>
- are from or have buy in from the local County 250 Committee.
- demonstrate partnerships and matching funds (exceeding the required match amount is encouraged).
- have a clear budget and thought-out project plans (especially for Major and Premier Projects).
- demonstrate impact and longevity.

The following pages include step-by-step instructions on using Discover SC WebGrants and more details about scoring. These criterion will be used to select projects that have a greater opportunity of being successful and having a significant impact on the community, region, and state. Each criterion will be awarded a score based on the given range of points. The total of the scores for all five categories will be the overall score for the application. The maximum score an application can receive is 105 (including bonus points).

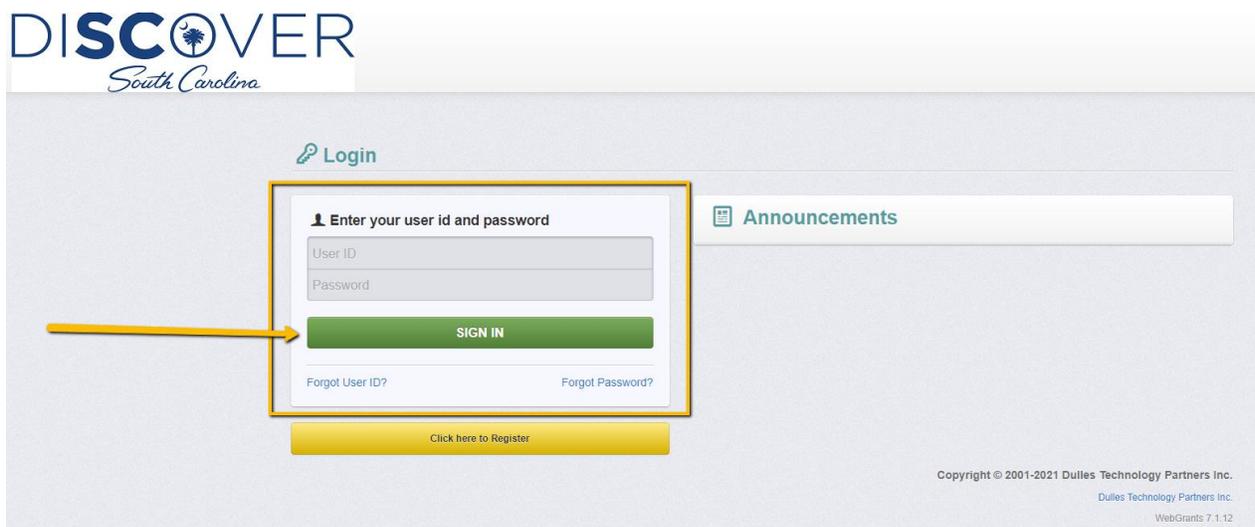

- On the **Home Page**, click on tab for Resources >Grants.

Logging into the WebGrants System

- Under any grant type, scroll to the how to apply section. There should be a link to <https://www.scpgrants.com/login.do>.
- On the **Login Page**, Click on User ID on the left side of your page under Login



- Enter your User ID | Enter your Password | WebGrants should have sent you a temporary password when you registered (or SC250 registered for you). First time signing in, the system will probably ask you to reset your password.
- Click on Button **Sign In**
- Can't remember your User ID? It is usually your first initial +last name +1 (all lowercase, no spaces).
- Can't remember your Password? Click the **Forgot Password?** Link above the yellow button.

Notes before you Start your Review:

- Use the WebGrants Menu, not the Browser Menu.
- WebGrants is compatible with many different browsers; please feel free to use the browser of your choice.
- Read the instructions on the screen for navigating the system.
- The system does not auto save.
- If you hover over a line and it turns green, you can click anywhere on the line to select that item.

- o December 2025 to May 2026, this answer can also include information about how the project fits a Carolina Day menu item. Commissioners still prefer a connection to the American Revolution so those projects should score higher.

(5 points) - The applicant can mention a larger project goal, but make sure there are specific results of this funding (grant deliverables). Note that this response should be about tangible items while the longevity question can be about the emotional or overarching result these items have - i.e. inspire a new generation of historians. In the Measurement of Success answer, has the applicant clearly defined the matrix to measure success? Examples may be 1) attendees at the event 2) survey of participants 3) media coverage 4) social media interaction 5) click on a website, etc.

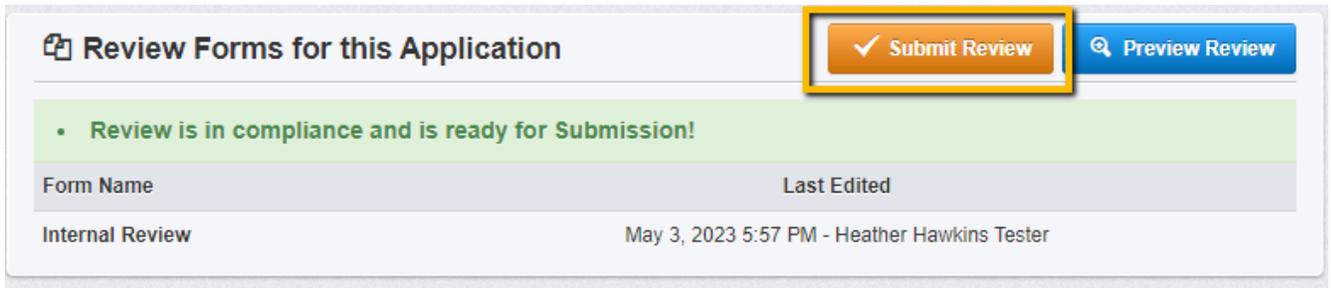

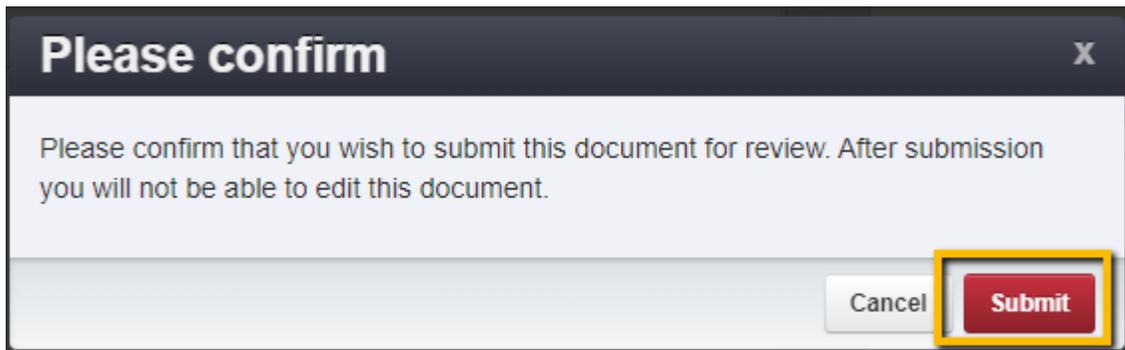

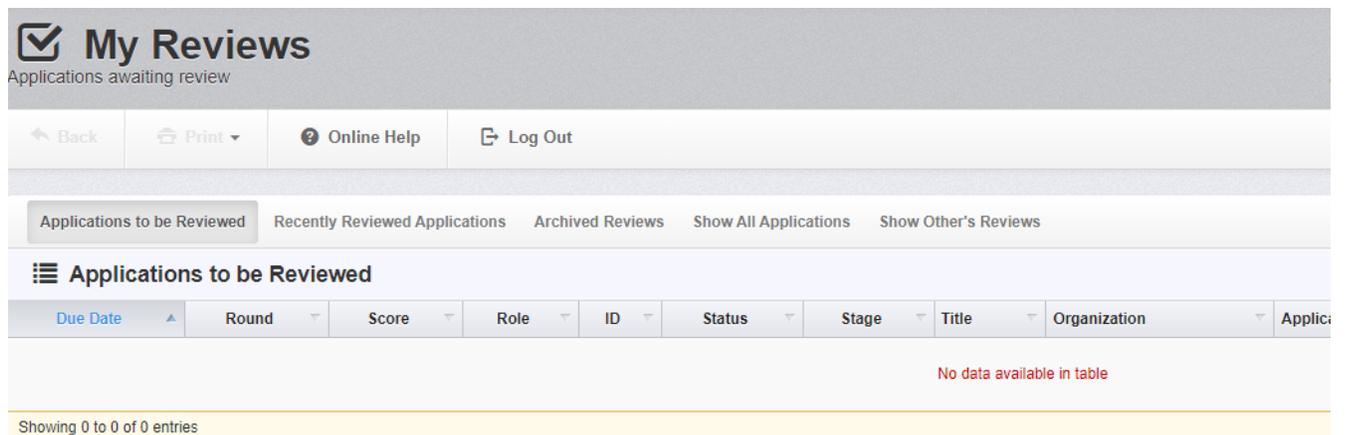

CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY**

The SC American Revolution Sestercentennial Commission (SC250) Grant Review team/staff/committee members will be considered to have a conflict of interest when such grant application involves:

- the review team/staff/committee member, his/her spouse, minor, child, partner, or employee;
- a profit or nonprofit organization for which the review team/staff/committee member serves as an officer, director, trustee, agent, partner or employee; and/or
- any person or organization with which the review team/staff/committee member is negotiating a verbal or written agreement.

Apparent Conflict of Interest: Even though the review team/staff/committee members may not technically have a conflict of interest with regard to a particular application, they may feel that they are unduly biased, or have personal affiliation with an applicant. If so, they should declare an apparent conflict of interest and conduct themselves as if they had an actual conflict of interest.

Any member of the review team, staff, board, or advisory committee reviewing or approving grant applications shall disclose to SC250 any connection which that member has with the applicant (whether that connection is direct or indirect). Panelists are not allowed to review, score, or comment on any application with which they have a conflict of interest.

Grant Review team/staff/committee members agree to notify SC250 immediately if in the future they are assigned grant reviews for any organization in which they have apparent or actual conflicts of interest.
